THE BSSRA VETERANS MATCH

for the Fletcher Cup

GENERAL

The match takes place annually between 1st August and the following 30th April, and is fired under NSRA Rules and Regulations. The Competition is fired as a single stage.

TEAMS

Open to any number of teams of FIVE who are former pupils of any school. A competitor who has been a member of more than one school must represent the school of which he was last a pupil. Each competitor must not have been a pupil at the school during the period of the competition (so pupils who leave in July are now eligible to take part).

RANGE & TARGETS

Either 15 yards, 20 yards or 25 yards. The appropriate and most recent British NSRA 1989 Prone Position Target (2510BM/89~18) or equivalent at other ranges must be used. **The special labels issued by the BSSRA must be stuck to the reverse of each card immediately behind one of the target diagrams before the targets are given to team members to be fired, and NOT on the front.**

POSITION

Prone.

SHOTS

One per diagram. Ten rounds per competitor. Any number of sighting shots are permitted.

RIFLES and AMMUNITION

Any .22" LR rifle and ammunition conforming to NSRA regulations. Telescopic sights are not permitted.

SLINGS, DRESS & ACCESSORIES

These must conform to NSRA regulations.

COACHING and SPOTTING

Competitors must spot for themselves. No coaching is permitted.

TIMETABLE

Cards may be shot on different days and on different ranges, but if this is the case a separate Witness's Certificate must be completed and signed for each occasion. Cards must be fired between 1st August and the following 30th April, and sent to A.R.K.Clayton, Arncliffe, Lenton, Grantham, Lincolnshire, NG33 4HE. Cards received after 7th May (or, if a Sunday, the following day) will be disallowed.

SCORING

All targets will be scored by the scorer according to NSRA regulations. Shot holes must not be gauged or otherwise interfered with. In the event of a tie, NSRA counting-out rules will be applied.

SUPERVISION

The shooting of each card must be witnessed by either a CCF Officer, or a member of an NSRA Affiliated Rifle Club who is authorised to witness cards in NSRA competitions. A separate copy of the witness certificate must be completed by all those who act as a witness, and enclosed with the returned targets.

PRIZES

The number of sets of five medals awarded will depend on the number of teams entering.
